Second claimer Carl Thomson had a great race and deservedly took silver in 1.39.51, whilst Helen Middleton finished fourth in the ladies championship clocking 2.05.31, just a little outside her pb. (see Results Round-up)

In addition to Lucy and Louise, John Hughes who was also taking part in his first walking event qualified for their "Five in the Hour" badges.

The home club was the only one to finish a team in the ladies section, but there was a tight finish in the four to score men's event, where Ilford AC emerged triumphant.

Busy EHAC Walkers

Almost Three BMAF Gold's At the British Masters National Indoor championships at LVS on Sunday 8^{th} March, the club had nine walkers in action, of which seven collected medals. Helen Middleton (w45) and Arthur Thomson (m70) came away with gold and Ken Livermore (m75) was just 12/100ths of a second away from making it a hat-trick, as he was out-dipped on the line by Stourbridge's Eric Horwill. Ken's Silver was one of three, the other two being Ron Powell (m70) and Amos Seddon (m65), whilst Sean Pender (m55) and Peter Howard (m65) collected bronze. Norma Grimsey and Bernie Hercock were the two who left the championships empty handed. Their times for 3km were: Arthur 16.40, Helen 17.07, Amos 17.45, Ron 18.39, Sean 18.52, Peter 19.45, Norma 21.44, Ken 21.51 and Bernie 22.08.

Carl Thomson set a Guernsey all-comers two mile record of 14.41 in the Eric Waldron race on 29th March and a week later won the Island's Chilcott 7 miles in 54.40.

The full result of the LVS track 3km on 4th March which eight members were involved appears in *Results* Round-Up. Sean Pender elected to compete in the Molly Barnett 10km at Coventry which staged on the same day. He finished twenty-fifth in 61.07

Making a comeback at the European Indoor championships in Italy on 29th March was Rod Dunn who finished ninth in the 5km in a time of 29.25. We look forward to seeing him at LVS on 23rd May.

Meanwhile, ultra distance specialist Sue Clements has also been on the international trail. She visited Israel and completed a 66km walk around Lake Kenneret (Sea of Galillee), The Jerusalem half marathon and the two day IML Gilboa walk. She also did a 48km desert training walk and spent time with the great Shaul Ladany.

Just over fifty walkers were among the five hundred runners that took part in the last Nicola Five on Canvey Island on 29th March. Helen Middleton was third lady in 46.05, whilst in fifth Alan Ellam did 45.20. Don Cox was eighth in 47.00, Paul Cole ninth in 51.59, Peter Howard tenth in 54.57, Bernie Hercock thirteenth in 56.23 and Ken Livermore fifteenth in 64.39.

Results Round-up

Anne Belchambers and Trevor Jones weren't at Pat Furey Five on 14th March, because they were tackling the historic **Finchley Twenty** miles road race on the following day, along with several hundred runners. Trevor finished 381st clocking 3.05.44 and Anne 439th in a time of 3.45.34

Steve Uttley headed the fourteen strong field that contested the 3km walk in the **LVS track meeting on 4th April.** His time of 15.42 put him well clear of Carl Lawton in second place but well short of Scot Davis's track record of 13.22 set in May 2007. Once again newcomer Lucy Kent impressed and the sight of Brian Sturt back in action again, was a welcome one.

Congratulations to *Leaguer* John Hall (m60), who was a double gold medallist at the recent **European Masters** Indoor championships in Ancona, Italy. His winning times were: 3km 14.58 and 5km 25.48.

Leaguer Phil Barnard timed at 38.55 was the first walker home in the **Nicola Five on 29th March** with Verity Snook in 42.50 and Di Bradley in 42.58, filling second and third places.

Ten juniors were among the forty-five walkers who started in this years **UKA/RWA national 10km/20km championships**, at the Shrewsbury Sports Village's purpose built cycling racecourse on Sunday 12th April. The weather was warm and I thought that the circuit provided an excellent test of speed, technique and fitness. Luke Finch demonstrated all three in the process of clocking 88.31 to win.

The 1964 Olympic champion Ken Matthews sent the field on its way and Finch went straight into the lead with only had Ben Wears, the national 10m champion for company. But it wasn't for long and the Redcar man had to give ground after a couple of the 1km circuits. Unchallenged, Finch stuck to his task and recorded probably the widest winning margin in the event's history. Wears eventually fell foul of the judges which left Carl Thomson and the much improved Paul Evenett in an intense mid-race duel, before Thomson eventually got clear to take second place in 99.41 to Evenett's 100.57.

Dave Kates ninth in 120.00, Steve Uttley eleventh in 121.56 and Lol Dordoy fifteenth in 124.57, constituted Ilford AC's championship winning team with 265 points, to Birchdfield's 258 made up by John Contandinou tenth 121.42, Dave Manning twelfth 122. 09 and Tony Collins twentieth 130.47 with, as reported on the front page EHAC in third with 248. Surrey with 187 points and Redcar with 181 were the other clubs to finish teams

Jo Jackson in 95.57 finished well clear of Lisa Kehler 104.18, in the ladies championship and Di Bradley was a comfortable third in 153.39. Leicester WC's Fiona McGorum who walked so well in February's national ten retired, but a battling Sue Rey and Sarah Lightman ensured that the Club were able to add the 20km team championship medals to the 10 miles runner-up ones that they won at LVS.

The juniors seemed to relish walking with the seniors and with international places to be confirmed had plenty of incentive. Birchfield's Holly Smith in 56.26 and Mark O'Kane in 47.46 both scored decisive victories. Tonbridge AC Ladies were the only junior team to close in.

Other *Leaguers* performances were: an excellent fourth for Trevor Jones in 105.39, Dave Sharpe nineteenth in 129.13, Anne Belchambers was fifth in 131.49, Fiona Bishop sixth in 136.07 and Jo Miles ninth 146.34. Unfortunately, Scott Davis had been caught up in traffic and missed the start but was timed at 97.10.
