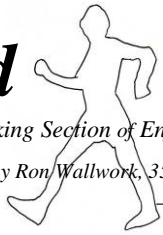

Bernie Hercock underwent a quadruple heart bypass surgery on Tuesday 24th May and was walking down the corridor three days later. He is expecting a pacemaker implant soon, after which he can look forward to being discharged. When I spoke with him he asked me to thank all the people who had visited him and sent him messages of goodwill and encouragement. He was overwhelmed and looks forward to being able to do it personally in the not too distant future.

EHAC at BMAF 10km The event took place at Oxford the day after the Badge races at LVAC and again it was very hot which made conditions extremely difficult for seventeen walkers who came under starters orders. Helen Middleton (W45) added to her collection of BMAF titles clocking 58.28, only twenty-eight seconds slower than her 10km split the previous day which clearly demonstrates that she has a high level of fitness and excellent recovery powers.

In the absence of her training companion Arthur Thomson, captain Ron Powell stepped up with 68.36 to extend the club's three year tenure of the M70 category, whilst Sue Barnett (W60) also collected gold with a 69.35 and Diana Braverman (W55) was a runner up with 71.50. Peter Howard (M65) who struggled with an injury persevered and finished in 76.16. *Leaguer's performances in this event appear in Results Round-up.*

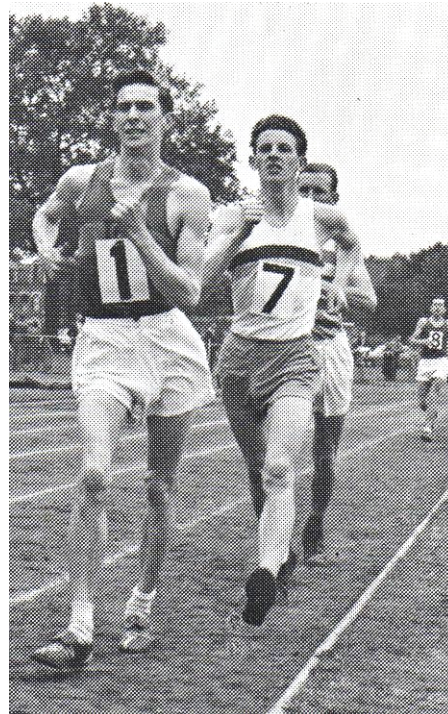

Spotlight on Doug Fotheringham

Doug who celebrated his eightieth birthday on 18th April has been an ever-present on the race walking scene for almost sixty years.

Born and brought up in Lincolnshire, Doug joined the Metropolitan Police in 1950 and had his first race a year later in 1951 and has raced in every one of the fifty-nine years since.

He reached the rank of Inspector in a police career that spanned thirty-five years and was a stalwart of the Metropolitan Police Athletic Association as a competitor and as administrator, serving as the Association's Honorary Race Walking Secretary for ten years.

However, most connected with the sport will associate him with Belgrave Harriers whose famous claret and gold colours he has worn with pride since joining the club in 1953. His first race in those famous colours was probably on 19th September in the MPAAA Novice six mile race where he finished twelfth in 58.16.

Doug described by a colleague as a solid reliable clubman, trained and rubbed shoulders with some of the great Belgravians in the halcyon days of the fifties and sixties when they dominated the domestic scene and produced a number of internationals. In most clubs he would have surely collected a national team medal or two.

In 1981 he established himself as a major force in Veteran athletics when capturing two gold medals at the World championships staged in New Zealand. He retired from international competition in 2007, but in the intervening twenty-six years amassed thirty-five medals; seven gold at world championships and five at European championships. The statistics also show another seven silver and bronze at world level, along with nine silver and four bronze in European events.

He is a regular supporter of the *Enfield League* and on behalf of everyone connected with it; I congratulate him on reaching his eightieth birthday and his wonderful contribution to the sport, which we all anticipate will continue for many years to come.

Doug's wife Maureen who is often to be seen at League events recently underwent a partial knee replacement operation and I'm sure that all will join me in wishing her a speedy recovery

Matters Arising from previous issues

The mystery walkers on the back page of the **March** issue were Arthur Thomson and Mal Blyth

Ron Penfold who raised the Inter-County team result query in the **May** issue, got in touch to say that we were both correct, because Sussex were third in the men's team race and Middlesex were third in the men's overall category. Ex-walker and now nationally recognised endurance event official Joe Mower pointed me in the direction of the UKCAU web-site which confirmed this as did the most recent copy of Race Walking Record.

Results Round Up

So far as the walking fraternity was concerned, Bernie Hercock's cardiac arrest after 2km race dominated matters at the first of the season's **SCVAC Herts & N.Middlesex League** meetings at LVAC on Monday 10th May. Helen Middleton 10.46 (pb) and Norma Grimsey 13.01 led home the eight ladies with Barbara Edlin fourth in 13.48. Sean Pender 11.27, Brian Sturt 13.21 and Bernie 13.49 scored for the club behind Fransisco Reis 9.17, Steve Uttley 9.52 and Steve Allen 10.13. John Borgars 12.41 was the only other *Leaguer* in the race

Ian Richards scored his second win in the **2010 Vets AC Series** being staged at Battersea Park throughout the summer. The distance on 11th May was five miles and Ian's time was 40.32. Peter Ryan 42.20 and Shaun Lightman 44.03 were second and third. Helen Middleton 45.07, Sean Pender 48.49 and Ron Powell 53.35 were the Club walkers with Bernie Hercock a notable absentee among the eighteen starters, all but two of which bettered the hour.

Essex walking plummeted to what was probably an all-time low when its **10km championship** on 16th May attracted only two entries. Without the five guests it would have looked even worse. An unwell Fransisco Reis won in 51.40 from one of the county's walking stalwarts Steve Uttley 53.28 and Steve Allen (*Barnet*) 55.27. Setting a track pb of 57.07 Helen Middleton was fourth and behind her was Sean Pender 61.54 and second Essex finisher David Sharpe 64.22. There was one disqualification.

Trevor Jones (M50) 55.32 was the overall winner in the **BMAF 10km track championship** held at Oxford on Sunday 23rd May. Other *Leaguer's* performances were; *Barnet's* Steve Allen (M50) 59.38 (58.42 10k split at LVAC the day before), *Ron Penfold* (M65) recovering from injury, 61.01, Shaun Lightman (M65) 62.30, Peter Hannell (M65) 63.16, Ken Bobbett (M65) 65.46, *Anne Belchambers* (W55) 67.41, Fiona Bishop (W50) 72.27. *Names in italics are category winners.*

Twenty four walkers representing fourteen counties took part in the **CAU inter-counties** track and field championships which took place at Bedford on 31st May. Looking at the result, it seems to have been a good day for race walking; good fields and plenty of young walkers. Jo Jackson (North East) and Alex Wright (Surrey) were the individual winners of the 3km events with times of 12.57 and 11.38 respectively. The full result will appear in Race Walking Record, RaceWalkUK and UKCAU. The highest placed *Leaguer's* were; fourth Diane Bradley (Kent) 15.31 and eighth Fransisco Ries (Middlesex) 13.58. For the club Helen Middleton (Bedfordshire) was eighth in 16.25 and Arthur Thomson (Herts) twelfth in 15.46.
