As reported in the August issue, EHAC won the Woodford Tuesday Walks series for the first time in the nineteen year history of the event and Helen was the leading female walker

Bernie Hercock, Helen Middleton with the *Phil Embleton Shoe* and Sean Pender with *Reg Youldon Rose Bowl*.



The 2.5 mile circuit, checked for accuracy since the county 10 miles championship back in February, was used for this race and met with the approval of most participants.

Conditions were good; overcast but mild and some excellent racing took place. Fransisco Reis was an easy winner, but Fabian Deuter in his second appearance matched Trevor Jones stride for stride until the last mile or so and Sue Miles who impressed on her debut at Cophthall stadium in June, registered another good performance, mixing it with Steve Allan, Amos Seddon and Alan Ellam; all four crossing the finish line within twelve seconds.

Sue Barnett set yet another pb, whilst Anthony Cotton and Anne Pickard bettered the hour on their first attempts at the distance.

Race Aftersnotes

It was nice that **Ron** was able to bring along his wife **Mary**, who is progressing well after being hospitalised a month or so ago and hope that we see her at future fixtures. Ron tells me that all being well he will be producing his photographic montage of the season at the open seven.

Mal Blyth who is often to be seen marshalling at our races celebrated his 75 birthday a few days after the race. Mal's walking career stretches way back to the hey-day of Leicester Walking Club in the 1950's and he has an impressive collection of medals and awards to his credit. *Happy Birthday Mal!*

Doug Fotheringham, double world Vets champion in 1981 and an ever present at *League* events, started a new career at this race; as Judges Recorder.

Athletics Hall of Fame - Harold Whitlock and Ken Matthews MBE

Congratulations to Harold Whitlock and Ken Matthews on becoming the first race walkers to be voted into the EA Athletics Hall of Fame. Both were Olympic and European champions; Harold at 50km and Ken at 20km and I was privileged to know them.

In 1958 when I was getting involved in the sport, Harold was a legend; in addition to his international success he had re-written the London-Brighton record book and set many distance records. I saw him at events, met him at coaching sessions and received an encouraging letter from him following my rather mediocre international debut in 1963, which gave me a tremendous boost.

Ken along with Stan Vickers was dominating the sprint scene in the late fifties and it was their feats which really inspired me. In the Rome Olympic 20km of 1960, Stan Vickers walked brilliantly to take the bronze medal to add to the European gold that he had won two years earlier in Stockholm, but for Ken it was a disaster; he didn't even finish the race.

However, by 1964 Ken had led GB&NI to two Lugano Cup wins, won gold in Belgrade at the European championships of 1962 and crossed the finish line in the Tokyo Olympic 20km almost 400m in front of his nearest rivals; East Germany's Dieter Lindner and Vladimir Golubnichiy the Russian winner in Rome.

It was with great pride that I wore Great Britain & NI colours along side Ken in the successful 1963 Lugano Cup campaign and I'm also delighted that he is to be RWA President for 2012, a position also held by Harold in 1955/56.

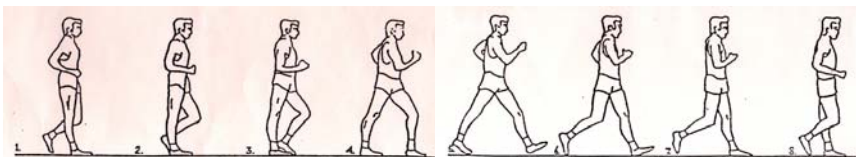

Results Round-up

The annual **Ryan Cup 10kms** walking match between the Police and Civil Service took place on 28th September at Birmingham's Cannon Hill Park in unseasonably hot conditions. Amos Seddon in finishing sixth in 59.50 also occupied third place in the Police championship which was won by Peter Ryan in 56.01. Gary Smith was seventeenth in 65.13 and Liz Man Rey retained her 5km police title in 35.52. Current *League* leader Steve Uttley won the race in 55.14 to win his first CS road title and John Hall was fourth and CS third in 56.25. Maureen Noel with 30.32 retained her CS 5km championship.

In record temperatures for the month, Scott Davis duly won his seventh consecutive **RWA/UKA national 50km** title at Northampton on 2nd October in a time of 4.45.22. In doing so, he equalled the great Don Thompson's sequence of victories in this event set between 1956 and 1962. Maureen Noel with a time of 5.55.31 scored her third win in succession, her fifth in six years and was the only one of the five women who started to finish. Only seven of the sixteen men that started completed the distance and two were classified. Angie Alstrachen and Sean Pender were among the casualties retiring at 27km and 30km respectively. Yorkshire WC's Richard Spenceley 5.32.53 was runner-up and Lancashire WC's Adrian Edwards third in 5.37.27. Ilford AC added yet another national team trophy to their collection; Ed Shillabeer and Bob Dobson notching up his 125th 50km being Scott's back-up men.

Six of the nine walkers who contested the **supporting 10km race** were *Enfield League* regulars and they occupied the first six places. They were: Fransisco Reis 51.06, Steve Uttley 54.20, John Hall 56.23, Helen Middleton 60.13, Arthur Thomson 61.46 and Mark Culshaw 62.43.

The first of Surrey Walking Club's winter series of races, the **Gazette Cup 4 miles** got underway at Monks Hill on Saturday 15th October. Mark Easton notched up his eighth consecutive win in this event and his fourteenth overall since his first twenty-six years ago. His time was 31.34 and behind him in the minor placings were, Steve Uttley 33.20 and Diane Bradley 36.34. EHAC's highest placed walker was Helen Middleton 38.04 and behind her in ninth were Sean Pender 39.52, twentieth Bernie Hercock 47.58 and Ken Livermore 53.48.

The following day in the **Harwich 5 mile road run**, which attracted over three hundred competitors, Amos Seddon clocked 37.14 in 129th place and was second in the M70 class. He wont thank me for mentioning this, but 37.45 was his five mile split time when winning the 1980 Leicester Mercury 20 miles in 2.31.33.

In warm, sunny conditions on 22nd October, the first race of the new **Cambridge H Winter League 5km** was won by junior Cameron Corbishley 23.41. He headed Fransisco Ries 24.23 and Steve Uttley 25.31. Diane Bradley 27.20 was the women's winner, Helen Middleton 28.21 was second and Sue Barnett 31.36 third. In thirteenth and fourteen places were Peter Howard 34.08 and Bernie Hercock. Twenty-three took part in the senior event. _____

From Liz Man Rey Thank you for your email. I was indeed fortunate enough to win a gold medal for Ladies Senior A race walking at the World Police and Fire Games. As Gary mentioned the organisation was diabolical. In addition to a reduction in distance and rescheduling we ladies were waiting trackside from 1200 to 1700 when we raced, constantly being told that the event was would soon be on. With no water, locked changing rooms (yes, seriously!) and blazing sun as soon as I finished I walked off to find any refreshments and irritatingly left my watch running.

Despite assurances that results would be published they have not and across all sports the organisers have managed to include disqualified competitors, omit others and mess up timings so I am not holding my breath as regards timings!

I was furthermore delighted to maintain my national PSUK title on 28/09. Next year I hope to bring a team of Essex women to the PSUK event, as both this year and last year I was the only Essex lady against 4 Lancashire ladies.

Mikk Bradley hasn't been seen since the final Woodford Tuesday meeting on 30th August when he set a 3km pb of 16.21 and picked up a hamstring injury in the process. It threatened to kibosh his plan to run in the Berlin Marathon, but he discovered that the injury didn't affect his running, so rounding off a five races in eleven days final preparation by doing the Lee Valley event, was surprised to win it in 3.01.08. In Berlin he finished 171st in 3.01.30 and was ninth in his age group. He wont be at the open Seven, but is looking to set a host of walking pb's in 2012.

The first event in November is the **Surrey WC Adington Vase 7 miles** on the 5th. It starts at 2.30pm.
