The races are incorporated in the LEE VALLEY OPEN MEETING and whilst the whole of the 1km event will take place on the track, the other categories will start on the track before going out to complete their distances on the road.

Moulton Walks - Safety Issues

As reported last year, concern has been expressed about the safety of the course. It centres mainly around the bunching of walkers on both sides of the road, particularly the stretch leading to and away from the turn. The refusal by many walkers to 'keep into the left was the major cause of the problem. We do share the highway with motorists and have to be alert to that.

It would be such a pity to lose this event from the fixture list, but there is a real danger that this could happen!

This year's event will go ahead on Saturday 4th June and in an effort to minimise risk; **Amblers** and **Ramblers** will use an off-road route and the **Five mile Road Walk** over the traditional course will remain open to all who wish to test themselves and record a time.

The usual awards and memento's will be issued to all finishers in both sections and any proceeds will be distributed to 'Polio Plus' and the Moulton Village Hall, Fund. Forms for this year's event will be available shortly

The superb wooden trophy pictured here was given to Ron Powell by May MacSweeney many years ago. It is not certain whether it was won by her husband Alf or brother in law Sid. Ron has now passed it on to the club and suggestions for conditions of its award are sought. For those who may not know, it was Alf MacSweeney, a printer by trade who founded the *Race Walking Record*.



Thirty-eight of the forty-three starters completed the full distance in second race of this year's series in damp chilly conditions. Four counties appointed the race as championships and Essex and Middlesex had reasonable turn outs.

Dominic King and twin Daniel using the race as a warm up for the IOM 20km next weekend and as part of their build up for the Dudince 50km at the end of March, were untroubled and finished well clear of the field. Fransisco despite a troublesome injury occupied third place.

There were notable debuts at the distance by Angie Alstrachen, Noel Blatchford and Sue Barnett and once again, Dave Kates was the first *Centurion* to finish.

The extended course seemed to get approval from the majority of participants, although there was a suggestion that it was short. The fast times and a satnay watch reading was the evidence for this and it will be re-measured. However it should be borne in mind that the reduction in U-turns makes a huge difference; saving on the time lost negotiating them and equally important, fewer breaks in the walker's rhythm. I take the point raised by one walker who felt that judging concentrated on the few yards of rubber rumble-strip was a little pernicious.

It was nice to see Scott Davis at the start and he told me that he is currently taking a break from walking, but fully intends to compete again later in the year. This is good news, because Scott's presence in races certainly gingers up the competition, whilst his immaculate style is a great advert for the event.

Results Round up

There were nine starters for the **SVAC Indoor 3km championship** staged at LVAC on Sunday 20th February. First home of the six finishers was Fransisco Reis M50 in 14.27.Second was John Hall M60 in 15.16 and third Steve Allen M50 in 15.42. It's worth noting that Fransisco and Steve had done the ten miles *League* race the previous day. Club captain Ron Powell was of the three disqualifications.

There were twenty-two starters in the **BMAF indoor 3km championships** at the same venue a week later, among them seven EHAC members. The result set out below shows that not only did the club have a good medal haul, but that all but three of the starters collected medals and two of those that didn't weren't allowed to finish the race. Congratulations to Anne Wheeler and Maureen Spelman on setting new British records. Reis and Hall improved on their previous weeks performances and Ron Powell bounced back from the Dq he experienced.

The UKA/EA/RWA national 10 miles championships took place at Coventry on Sunday 6th March in what I understand were reasonable conditions for the thirty-eight men and ten women who took part. Notable absentees were Jo Jackson, Luke Finch and Tom Taylor.

Alex Wright won comfortably in 70.46 with Daniel King 72.34 second and Mark O'Kane 72.59 third, whilst Neringa Aidietyte 76.19, won by a distance from Lisa Kehler 84.38 and Diane Bradley 89.38. Times were not particularly quick by today's standards. Four men, two of which were disqualified, didn't finish.

Arthur Thomson thirteenth in 93.49 was the only EHAC walker who took part. Trevor Jones seventh in 85.30, Steve Uttley 87.31 ninth and Steve Allen 93.08 twelfth, were the leading *Leaguers*.

The injury that Fransisco Reis has been carrying for some months became so acute that he was forced to retire and consequently any chance Ilford AC entertained about collecting team medals dissipated.

I wasn't there, but looking at the results, I was impressed by the 89.29 performance of sixteen year old Nathan Duncan from Yorkshire Race Walking Club. I was also delighted to see that through the backing up efforts of Colin Scott 94.05 and Richard Spenceley 97.59, his club, which was prominent in years gone by, were able to spring major surprise to become National team champions. Redcar RWC and Surrey WC occupied the minor team positions and Leicester RWC and Redcar RWC were the only teams to finish the women's event.

The final race of the **Cambridge H 2010/11 league** took place on 12th March. Over the usual testing 5km course the race winner was Fransisco Reis in 00.00. Sean Pender and Bernie Hercock were among the starters. Bernie finished second overall in the final League table, behind Chris Flint and in front of Dave Ainsworth. All three were the only people who took part in the three fixtures that were staged. The December race was weathered off.

Helen Middleton was a class apart when lapping the field to win the Women's **Eastern Counties Indoor 1 mile** Walk at Lee Valley Arena on Sunday 13th March, clocking 8.53.38. The fastest man was Fransisco in 7.45.
