## Amazing Angie

Angela Alstrachen, who only took up race walking fifteen months ago qualified as a *Centurion* at the Surrey Walking Club 100 hundred staged at Lingfield Park, over the week-end of 2nd/3rd July. Her time of 23.42.48 earned her *Centurion* number 1095 and she becomes the first Suffolk and EHAC woman to join the select band that make up the *Centurion* brother/sisterhood. What is remarkable about her achievement is that she decided only three weeks before the event, against the advice of her coach and a friend to enter and have a go. Needless to say both were delighted to be wearing dunce's caps after her outstanding walk. The forty-five year old has previously enjoyed masters' success at international level in events up to 400m; not the kind of background to set one up for ultra distance challenges.

The club's other participants; Serena Queeney retired after almost nine hours and Sean Pender forty minutes later. Their distances were 37.19 and 41.93 miles respectively.

Four days later on 9th July at Basildon, Helen 2.06.12 won the women's **Southern RWA 20km championship** and John Ralph 2.01.39 was runner up in the men's event. Sean Pender 2.12.37 having his third outing in a week was fifth and Arthur Thomson sixth secured an easy EHAC team win.

**Results Round-up** Seventy-six walkers started The **Surrey Walking Club Hundred** at 2pm on 2nd July at Lingfield Park and 19 hours, 4 minutes and 7 seconds later the winner Bart Snoeren (Dak Drunen) crossed the finish line to become the first new *Centurion* in the brotherhoods Centenary year. The mercurial Sandra Brown 20.18.23 was the second to finish and was first lady and first Brit home. Not far behind her in third was Rein Pistorius ((Rotterdam) 20.26.26. Ian Statter 21.12.25 had his best race since his Millennium triumph at Newmarket to finish seventh and made it an RWA individual and team championship double for the promoting club.

Fourteen UK walkers were among the thirty-six who completed the hundred within the time limit; for six of them along with nine continental competitors it was the first time they had done so, thus qualifying to wear the famous badge. *A full report and result appears on the Centurions 1911 web-site*

The **Southern RWA 20km championship** held at Basildon on Saturday 9th July was dominated by EHAC who fielded four of the eleven starters and their results appear on the first page. The overall winner was Peter Ryan 1.55.26, in third Kevin Knight 2.10.15, Chris Flint 2.12.14 fourth, and Shaun Lightman 2.16.59 in sixth. Maureen Noel 2.10.37 was the women’s runner-up, Noel Blatchford 2.12.10 was third and Judy Howard 2.23.03 fourth. The latter two comprising Abingdon’s winning ladies team.

Helen Middleton 11.25 was the first lady to finish in the **Southern Vet T&F 2km** walk at Hemel Hempstead on Monday 25th July. The overall winner was Fransisco Reis in 9.43, second was Steve Uttley in 9.59 and third Steve Allen in 10.25. In addition to Helen, Enfield colour bearers in the seventeen strong field were; fifth Sean Pender

11.55, eleventh Norma Grimsey 13.05 and occupying the last three places, Bernie Hercock 14.53, Ken Livermore 15.37 and Alan Flavell.

Sean Pender 50.13 fourth, Barbara Edlin 58.54 ninth and Bernie Hercock 63.26 in tenth position were the club's walkers at the **VAC's 5 miles** at Battersea Park on 26th July. The race winner was Mark Easton 40.50 and eleven walkers took part.

For the second week running a cycle track was the venue for an event. Redbridge was the venue for **Iford AC's summer open Five**. Fransisco Reis was the winner on a hot day in 41.48 from American guest Pablo Gomez 47.11. Amos Seddon was third 48.26, Alan Ellam fourth 48.39, Helen Middleton first lady 49.36, Gary Smith tenth 53.55, Norma Grimsey second lady 57.55, Sue Clements third lady 61.23, Bernie Hercock fourteenth 63.49 and Ken Livermore fifteenth 68.24.

On the same day over at Norwich in the EVAC championships Sue Barnett 18.47 was second and Peter Howard 20.30 fifth. *Leaguer* Cath Duhig 17.52 won the race and Sue Smith 23.15 was sixth.

In hot conditions Helen Middleton 17.31 was the first club member to finish in the **Woodford Tuesday** series 3km on 2nd August. Barnet's Steve Allen 16.07 was first of the nine athletes to cross the winning line. For EHAC, third was Sean Pender 18.13, Gary Smith 18.17 fourth and last but not least Bernie Hercock 22.53.

### ***Transplant Games Gold for Joan Bell***

Britain's eight walkers in the World Transplant Games held in Sweden between 22nd/23rd June did very well. The distances were 3km for the women and 5km for the men. Joan Bell W60 22.10 won gold and Steve Whelan M45 32.05 although finishing fourth was awarded the bronze medal. The mode of progression displayed by the Iranian walker who was allowed to finish in third place was so diabolical, that no less than five countries lodged protests about the standard of judging, which thankfully did improve and was much better in later races. There were also team triumphs in the W50 and M60's categories.
