## Successful Pat Furey Five

Neringe Aidietyte who had recently attained an Olympic qualifying time totally dominated the third race of the 2012 series. Pat Furey the event sponsor was on hand to start the race and was assisted at the presentation by EHAC chairman John Mercer.

Francisco Reis retained the trophy he won last year and among a number of interesting duels that took place was the struggle for second place. Fabian Deuter registering his best time since he resumed race walking last year.

A number of other walker set pb's, including John Ralph who respectfully commented 'that even with that he couldn't get on terms with Super-vet Arthur Thomson', who is obviously on a high following his recent M75 world indoor 3km record. In addition, catching the eye was David Crane who as a youth was one of the county's top performers. Out of the sport for some years he turned out in the January Five at Donkey Lane, but was forced to retire with an injury. He had obviously put some training in since and on this occasion bettered ten minute mile pace.

Peter Ryan was the first *Centurion* home in his first *League* appearance since last year's Pat Furey Five. Ilford easily won the team race, but it was a close call for third between Hillingdon and Belgrave. *Full result page 2*

## WMA Gold for Gary Smith whilst Helen and Sue collect more National Gold

Gary Smith was a scorer in the GB M55 team triumph in the World Masters Championships held recently in Finland. He finished 12th in the indoor 3km in 17.22 and thirteenth in the 10km road event clocking 60.32.

Here at home, under the Lugano Rules in operation at the UKA/RWA national 20km championships staged at Redbridge on 14th October, Helen Middleton 2.04.47 in fourth place and Sue Barnet 2.28.45 in seventh won the Ladies team title. Sue's time was over two and half minutes faster than her previous best. Arthur Thomson 1.58.41 in eleventh and John Ralph 2.03.20 in thirteenth place were fourth in the men's team event.

**News from Sean Pender** was forced to retire at 70.380km in 11.04.49 in the Australian Coberg Harriers twenty four hour race in Melbourne 13th/14th April. I emailed him to see if he was alright and this is his reply.

Hi Ron, I'm disappointed, but fine. The weather was so hot you could grill kippers and it is reportedly the worst conditions and consequently the biggest ever drop out rate in the event's history. I felt fine and was going OK for the first five hours reaching the 42km point. However over the next couple of hours the wheels were coming off fast and although I tried to keep going I was well off the necessary pace and thought it best to retire.

My consolation prize was being asked to judge the Australian Masters championship.

Hello Ron and Joan, I trust you are both well. Thank you for another great Enfield Newsletter mentioning so many top names from the past. I was just reflecting the other day on how we give due praise to leading walkers, but often not the Coaches who play such a big part in their success.

The Late Great Stan MANTOR of Enfield Harriers was certainly a Truly Outstanding Coach. He spent countless hours with watch in hand timing and observing Walking Styles in all weathers as well as motivating so many with letters and telephone conversations. To mention but a few top walkers that he trained over many years besides myself; Brian ELEY (7<sup>th</sup> in the 1968 Mexico Olympics), Peter and Mary WORTH, GB International over 24 Hrs and Multi-World Veterans Champion), evergreen top International Amos SEDDON (6<sup>th</sup> in the European Championships) and Alex ROSS (Scottish International Walker).

One of his secrets was that he would never divulge to you what training he had planned until you arrived and probably most would have thought twice about coming had they known in advance! Many past Enfield walkers will remember him for his friendly, sharp wit and advice from his many years experience as a great Club Walker and outstanding Centurion (1960 Leicester to Skegness 20.36.58). May he Rest in Peace.

Here's hoping you may be able to include some mention of this really great Coach and Mentor. Hoping to see you on Sat, 31<sup>st</sup> March. With love, Bill, Kath and our 2 pussies.

### ***Results Round-up***

Helen Middleton was the club's only walker who travelled to Bexley on 10th March for the final event of the **Cambridge Harriers 5km** Winter series. She was the first lady home in 28.46 and finished sixth overall. Race winner in 23.31 was Mark Easton who prevented young Cameron Corbishley's 24.04, clean sweep of series victories. Steve Uttley 25.47 in fourth and Steve Allen (*Bnt*) 27.55 in fifth were the other *Leaguers* competing.

Six Women and twelve men contested nine categories in the **BMAF Indoor 3km championships** at LVAC on Sunday 17th March. There were gold medals for Helen Middleton W45 17.04, Sue Barnett W60 18.52 and Arthur Thomson M75 16.45 and silvers for Sean Pender M55 18.50 and Ron Powell M75 19.49. *Leaguer* John Hall M60 15.16, won his age group, whilst Steve Allen (*Bnt*) M55 15.44 and Cath Duhig W55 17.24 picked up second place medals.

Nineteen seniors and four YAG's were in action at Steyning's **Slater/Bryce Walks** at Broadheath Track on 24th March. Helen Middleton was the club's only representative finishing second of the four women clocking 60.28 for the 10km. The promoting club provided the individual winners in Joan Lennon 58.36 and Ian Richards 49.38. Third was John Hall 54.56, eighth Shaun Lightman 61.31, eleventh Peter Hannell 65.20, Anne Belchambers third lady 68.38.

The **World Masters championships** took place in Jyvaskyla, Finland 3rd/8th April. There was an indoor 3km and 10km road race. Gary Smith's performances are documented on the first page. Stalwart *Leaguer* John Hall M60 collected a brace of bronze medals with times of 14.22 and 54.00 There were double event silver medals for Ian Richards M60 14.21/ 50.10, Noel Blatchford W60 17.50/62.16 and a 10km bronze for Ron Penfold M70 59.25. Barnet's Steve Allen M55 8th in both races 15.48/54.46 and collected a team winner's medal.

Thirty-three men and eight women came under starters orders for the **RWA/UKA national 20km championships** on 14th April. Conditions were good for racing over a 500m stretch of the Redbridge Cycle circuit. Neringe Aidityte 98.21 and Ben Wears 89.33 emerged as the national individual champions. At one stage Tom Bosworth who also bettered 90 minutes by eight seconds, look to have victory in his grasp but stopped with a suspected injury. Wears took full advantage of the opportunity and gained the advantage before the Tonbridge athlete managed to get going again. Becky Collins 1.57.34 was the second women home and I understand that ultra distance star Sandra Brown recorded a Masters W60 record when clocking 1.59.37 in third place

Congratulations to EHAC's great rivals Ilford AC, who through Steve Uttley 1.53.11, Dave Kates 2.03.41 and Steve Allen 2.06.59 took the men's team trophy from Belgrave; Stuart Kelgellon 99.54, Mark Culshaw 2.11.13 and Paul King 2.11.23 with Surrey WC; Mick Harran 2.10.10, Shaun Lightman 2.10.44 and Peter Hannell 2.14.06 in third place. Congratulations also to Peter Cassidy and his team on the excellent arrangements for the event.

A couple of personal after- thoughts: One, any casual observer would have had no difficulty in recognizing that it was a race walking event and yet eighteen of the forty-one walkers all received one or more red cards for **not** breaking contact. Two, is a U-turn every five hundred metres (39 in total) helpful in the quest for fast times?
