**Moulton Five** Sunny, warm conditions with only a gentle breeze provided perfect conditions for the race and Olympian Dominic King took full advantage to break the course record that he set in 2007. Moulton resident Callum Wilkinson also set a pb and Fransisco Reis although walking faster than his winning time last year was third.

Helen Middleton enjoying her come-back added a third victory to the ones she had in 2009 and 2010, whilst last year's winner Centurion Cath Duhig took second place and Anne Jones (*Nee Belchambers*) race winner in 2007 and 2008 was third.

There was no real contest for the team honours; Ilford AC with Fransisco, Peter Ryan and Steve Uttley in the first eight literally 'walked it' leaving Hillingdon, EHAC and Surrey to sort out the minor placings.

In addition to Callum Wilkinson, nine other local walkers had a go and at least four have vowed to return next year to improve their times and better the hour for the scenic, but testing course.

Over the years a feature of the event has been the support by renowned exponent's from the past and sure enough several were in attendance again; Eric Hall, Ray Middleton, Oliver Flynn, Roger Mills, Peter Marlow, Mark Easton – As event organiser I am indebted to them and thank them for their support.

In the 5km road championship at Horwich, Lancashire on 15<sup>th</sup> June, Sean Pender (M55) 31.30 and Ken Livermore (M80) 40.45 finished first and second in their respective age categories.

## **Busy Schedules & Mixed Fortunes**

Within the space of eight days young Callum Wilkinson experienced the elation of a 38.11 five mile pb at Moulton and the disappointment of a personal worst 50.01 10km at York in the EAA International Permit meeting. His great rival Cameron Corbishley 47.36 had the upper hand at York beating him for the first time this season and will no doubt be keen to repeat the result in the EA u20's 10km at Bedford on 23<sup>rd</sup> June and the British Games 5km a week later at Birmingham. The EHAC athlete will be equally determined to reassert his authority.

David Hoben an ever present *Leaguer* competed at Moulton on 31<sup>st</sup> May, at the Sussex AA/VAC 3km the following day, at the Oxford AA 3km on 3<sup>rd</sup> June, Rotterdam for the Dutch 50km on 7<sup>th</sup> June, the VAC's five mile fixture at Battersea on 10<sup>th</sup> June and the Jack Fitzgerald races on 14<sup>th</sup> June.

## Results Round-up

The day after Moulton, Anne and Trevor Jones were in action at the **Sussex AA 3km championships** which incorporated the **VAC championship**. The race was won by Ian Richards 14.12, with Trevor second in 15.33, whilst Anne 18.29 was runner-up to Penelope Cummings 16.44. Fiona Bishop was third lady in 19.18 and *Leaguer* David Hoben clocked 20.30.

There was a 1 mile walk in a **Masters inter-club** match staged at Cambridge University track on 4<sup>th</sup> June in which fourteen athletes took part. Second claim EHAC members Roger Lilley 9.12 and Pamela Abbott 10.24 were the race winners.

The **Oxford 3km championships and open race** took place on the same evening at Iffley Road. The Oxon champions were Graham Chapman 17.20 and Sue Beardsmore 17.56. *Leaguers* Steve Uttley 15.30 and Steve Allen 16.06 were the first two past the winning post. Steve Whelan 19.26, Sean Pender 19.02 and David Hoben 20.32 were the other Male finishers. Judy Howard 18.21 and Noel Blatchford 18.43 occupied the women's minor places.

Four days later on 8<sup>th</sup> June David Hoben was among a large party of British walkers contesting various distances up to 24 hours in a the RWV walks in Rotterdam and was first in the 50km in a time of 7.33.37.

The Sports Village Cycle track at York was a good venue for the **EAA Permit meeting** on 8<sup>th</sup> June and much credit is due to Ian Richards the event co-ordinator and his team for putting on a first class event which deserved better support from abroad than it received. With the constant search for fast qualifying times, perhaps the absence of more foreign walkers was the unknown nature of the course or perhaps the timing of it; only a week after the big meeting at La Coruna. The impressive win in 84.03 by Australian Dane Bird-Smith (who had raced in Spain the previous week and finished 6th) will allay any future concerns about the conduciveness of the circuit for quick times. Drew Quentin (NZ) 87.54 was runner-up and Ireland's Hickey Luke 88.13 third. Tom

Bosworth 89.10 was the first home walker to finish in fifth with Ian Richards 109.47 in ninth, Jon Hobbs 113.17 a place behind and Steve Uttley 117.57 twelfth.

Heather Lewis 99.58 was a clear winner in the ladies 20km race and was delighted to dip under 100 minutes for the first time. Becky Collins 58.04, Emma Achurch 52.24 and Cameron Corbishley 47.36 won their respective 10km races.

There were fifteen walkers in action at the **VAC 5 mile championship** at Battersea Park on 10<sup>th</sup> June. Peter Ryan 43.12, John Hall 47.11 and Arthur Thomson, 47.19 occupied the top three positions, followed by Andy Cox, 47.54, Shaun Lightman 48.24, Dan Maskell 49.34 and Paul King 51.47. *Leaguers*, Micky Harran 54.23, Russell Vroobek 55.58 and David Hoben 58.34 were also among the competitors. The first and only woman in the race was Maureen Noel 49.37.

On the same evening at **Woodford** the second **3km** race of their summer season took place and Pamela Abbott 20.37 was the solitary EHAC walker in the event. The winner was Steve Allen 16.10 from Stuart Bennett 16.24 and John Borgars 19.13. John Brock 20.15 and Peter Cassidy 20.55 made up the field.

The second **Jack Fitzgerald Memorial race** took place at Tilbury Park on 14<sup>th</sup> June and was a Martin family double. In the 10.3km Malcolm headed the field to win in 56.18 ahead of David Crane 56.44 and Steve Allen 59.22, whilst Angela 61.44 was the leading lady. EHAC's 'super vet' Arthur Thomson 62.33 along with *Leaguers* Dan Maskell 65.40, Michael Harran 67.51 and Dave Hoben 73.46 were among the seventeen who supported this VAC promotion. This event is on a lakeside course once used as the test bed for Britain's water speed record around popular beauty spot Campbell's lake.

Thirty-nine walkers took part in the **BMAF 5km road championship** at Horwich, Lancashire on 15<sup>th</sup> June and in addition to the performances of Sean Pender and Ken Livermore, Fiona Bishop 31.25 and fellow *Leaguer* Cath Duhig 31.40 occupied the top two places in the W55 section.
