2015 Enfield Walking League *A warm welcome to walkers regardless of age or standard*

Format: Although the aim is to create as many opportunities as possible, a minimum of ten events will constitute the 2015 *League* (best nine to score) each of which will carry a minimum of seventy points. However, events with more than forty-five participants will carry eighty. Points will be awarded in descending order, the winner being credited with the highest available. No race will carry bonus points!

Race Conditions: The event referee to be appointed by the organising committee.
All races will be under the 'Domestic rule – Contact with a walking mode of progression.
Decisions about permissible/appropriate apparel will be made by the event referee.

The **entry fee** will be **£5** per race, although there may be additional fees for championship or open events. There will be no entry fee for walkers under the age of 16.

The **League awards** will be presented at the first fixture of 2016 to Senior and YAG individuals, highest placed **Centurion**, senior mixed club teams of six (*which may include second claim members*) and a free race vouchers to walkers who have competed in six events.

Result Round-up

The **Brighton Boxing Day** walks have been going for over 80 years and this year the winner was Ian Richards in 46.37 in a race estimated at 5.5 miles. The other places were occupied by Trevor Jones 48.48, Dan Maskell 56.26, Paul Gaston 56.40, Shaun Lightman 57.53, Sarah Lightman 57.27 and Anne Jones 59.24.

The **Southern 10k and YAG championships** took place at Sutcliffe Park on 10th January. Sean Pender was the club's only entrant and he clocked 68.58. The quickest walker at the event was u20 Guy Thomas with an impressive 45.17 to win his age category. Francisco Reis 50.17 and Trevor Jones 53.04 were the leading seniors with other *Leaguers* John Hall 56.52, Dan Maskell 64.07, Maureen Noel 64.21, Shaun Lightman 66.07, Anne Jones 68.54, Mick Barnbrook 76.59 and Dave Ainsworth 85.42 also taking part. Guest Becky Collins 55.58 led the women home, with Heather Butcher (u20) 57.16 the next fastest and Penelope Cummings 58.10 behind her to claim the senior title.
