



## **International wins for Reis and Wilkinson**

### **Leaguers at the Euro-Masters championship**

Five Leaguers competed in the Euro Masters Indoor championships staged in Ancona, Italy between 29<sup>th</sup> March and 3<sup>rd</sup> April. There were two walks; a 3km indoors and a 5km on an adjacent street circuit. Fransisco Reis (M55) collected individual gold and silver medals with times of 13.59 for the shorter race and 23.57 the 5km. He also won a team silver as did Steve Allen (M55) who finished 13<sup>th</sup> in the 3km and 11<sup>th</sup> in the 5km registering times of 16.41 and 27.23. In the M60 category 3km Malc Martin (M60) 15.58 was only a place away from a podium finish and in the longer race 5<sup>th</sup> in 27.25. However, he and David Kates (M65) 15<sup>th</sup> 19.22 and 15<sup>th</sup> 32.04 (M65) backed up Ian Richards (M65) to land the M60 team gold. Angela Martin (W50) was 11<sup>th</sup> in the 3km with 19.45 and 13<sup>th</sup> in the 5km with 32.48.

### **Signs of an Optimistic International future for UK Walking**

Almost four years to the day, since trying out the race walk discipline Callum Wilkinson scored his first international victory in the junior 10km at the IAAF Challenge staged in Dudince, Slovakia on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> March and followed that performance up three weeks later with another in the IAAF Poblebrady Permit meeting.

At Dudince the 19 year old Enfield walker clocked 41.36, over a minute ahead of his nearest challengers Dominik Cerny (Slovak Republic) and Arturs Makars (Latvia). He was one of a group of five who led the field with an opening km of 4.25; whereupon he upped the pace to sub 4.10's and gradually drew clear of the field finishing with 5km splits of 20.54 and 20.42.

In Poblebrady he faced a much larger field (49 compared to 13) He led from start to finish, passing 5km in 20.24 with a over a half a minute advantage over the chasing group. However, with two cards on the board he was forced to ease back and although clocking a respectable 41.33, runner-up Giacomo Brandi (Italy) was able to close the gap to 11 seconds.

**The Poblebrady meeting might well turn out to be a significant staging post for Britain's young walkers. Cambridge Harrier Sophie Lewis-Ward finished a super second in the Youth Women's 5km in a pb of 23.36 resisting a late challenge from Turkey's Ayse Tekdal 23.41. The winner was another Turk, Meryen Bekmez in 22.53. In the Junior 10km Emma Achurch 47.49 finished within one place of the podium equalling her pb.**

**Back to the men and for them a team victory over Belarus and Italy! The scorers were Cameron Corbishley 10<sup>th</sup> in 43.05 and Guy Thomas 11<sup>th</sup> 45.15, pb's for both of them, but the good news doesn't stop there; there were also pb's for under 17's Chris Snook 46.22 and Tom Partington 46.41 which were qualifying times for the European Junior championships.**

The inaugural Cecil Gittins Memorial Races proved popular with an overall entry of 47 of whom 42 started, ranging in age from u15 to M75 to compete over distances from 1 to 15km. Distances up to 10km incorporated the third ERWL race of the 2016 series.



Commonwealth Games medallist Lisa Kehler (who was only contesting the 5km) and David Crane were the only people to take up the early pace cut out by the in-form Francisco Reis, but he was on his own after the first of the four undulating laps which made up the 10km course. David Crane was never far behind the leader and posted a pb for the distance. Malc Martin and SRWA President Chris Hobbs had a race long tussle, and not far behind them young Ollie Hopkins demonstrated why he is regarded as a future prospect with a well-judged race and good technique. There were excellent debuts at the distance by Andrea Ingram and Marshall Smith and it was good to see Fiona Bishop back racing following her absence in consequence of a broken wrist.

## Charles William Fogg - 1934/2016

The former policeman was born in Congleton, Cheshire in 1934 and was extremely proud to have served in the Royal Marines and made a Life member of EHAC.

He was known as Charlie and was a key figure in the Enfield team which enjoyed successful times in the 1960's and 70's and was a member of the club team, that in 1977 set a world record for the 10 x 100 miles relay, his ten mile legs averaged 7.31 apiece.

He was known as the 'hard man' by his rivals and the many athletes who came under his tutorage as a coach. Not just race walkers; in recent years he had built a reputation as a 'throws' coach.

Charlie made his international debut at 50km as member of the winning GB team that won the inaugural Lugano Trophy which later became the World Cup. He helped retain the Trophy in 1963, made the team again in 1965 and again ten years later in 1975.

Although he never managed to win the national 50km title he placed third in 1963/65 and 67 and made the top five on at least two other occasions and he won the gruelling Barking to Southend police race over a dozen times.

## Results Round-up

**More news from Dudince.** In the senior 20km Tom Bosworth also triumphed, breaking the 28 year old British record in the process with a time of 80.41. The previous record 82.03 was set by Ian McCombie in the Seoul Olympic Games where he finished 13<sup>th</sup>.

More than 60 walkers started the 50km where Dominic 32<sup>nd</sup> and Daniel King 39<sup>th</sup> recorded times of 4.08.00 and 4.19.12, whilst in the veteran's 5km Steve Allen finished 4<sup>th</sup> in 28.15.

Lithuanian Neringa Aidetyte a *League* supporter when she resided in London finished 7<sup>th</sup> in the ladies 20km in 91.20 and I understand her selection for Rio has been confirmed.

Previously not reported in *EnfWalker* was **Surrey WC's Development race** on 13<sup>th</sup> March at Lewes. Luc Legon won the 5km in 25.58 from Dan Maskell 31.48 and Micky Harran 31.49. Peter Hannell 32.06, Ron Penfold 32.18, Dave Hoben 34.56 and Shaun Lightman 34.56 made up the men's field. Luc's mum was second lady home in 33.46 behind Andrea Ingram 32.04 and in the 3km juniors Ollie Hopkins 15.30 and Jack Childs 16.00 both set pb's ahead of veteran Dave Stevens 22.53. Five other youngsters took part making a total 17 walkers in all and a very successful venture

There was some good racing at Steyning's **Slater Bryce 10km track** meeting at Horsham on 19<sup>th</sup> March. Francisco Reis 49.21 was a comfortable winner ahead of Ian Richards 52.35 (who won the Sussex title), but only six seconds separated Dan Maskell 64.39 and Paul Gaston 64.45 in the battle for third place. Even closer was the struggle for fifth position between Arthur Thomson 65.42 and Ron Penfold 65.44. Anne Jones 67.12, one of only two women in the starting line-up of 12 became Sussex champion and two other *Leaguers* Micky Harran 67.37 and David Hoben 73.46 also took part.

*Leaguer* Dan Maskell finished 5<sup>th</sup> in the Lancs WC **Macclesfield 20km** on 9<sup>th</sup> April. His time was 2.19.53 and the race was won by RWA national 50km champion Adrian Edwards in 2.02.06.

The first of the **Vets AC Summer series** of evening races at Battersea Park took place on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> April and was won by Daniel Halmstrand in 46.05. Peter Ryan in his first race for sometime was runner-up in 49.01 and Spanish student Carlos Cobo-Corrales 3<sup>rd</sup> in 49.36. Arthur Thomson was 5<sup>th</sup> in 53.51 in what was most likely his last race before celebrating his 80<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April. Other *Leaguers* in the 11 strong field were Shaun Lightman 51.15, Paul King 52.58, Fiona Bishop 57.05, and Dave Hoben 58.02.
