

The Ladies continue to set the pace

After seven fixtures, Helen Middleton continues to head the overall League individual table although with a race in hand leading man David Crane has her in his sights. The ladies continue to match the men so far as placings in the top six are concerned with three apiece and on points total are slightly ahead, 1164 to 1141. Team-wise, Ilford AC have reduced EHAC's lead to open up the possibility of becoming 2018 champions.

Same Day Podium Finishes for the Wilkinson Brothers

At the Schools International match at Grangemouth, Scotland, on 21st July, representing England in the 3km walk George Wilkinson finished second to Ireland's Oisin Lane and set pb in the process. Oisin's winning time was 13.36.63 to George's 14.02.33. However, the feature of the race was the Enfield walker's confidence to ignore the ambitious early pace and with splits of 4.51, 4.41 and 4.30 was the quickest walker on the track in the closing stages.

Almost simultaneously at the Anniversary Games in London, brother Callum was in the mix in the early part of the 3km walk and eventually finished third in 11.13.77. The race was won by Tom Bosworth in a world best of 10.43!

Correction: John Borgars has pointed out my error in the results of the BMAF 10km track championships at Horspath on 3^{rd} June. John actually finished the M70 runner-up and the winner was Roger Michell (Birchfield H) 64.29.

The **Senior 8 inter-county** match at Chelmsford on 24th June included a 3km walk. In bright sunny, hot conditions the King twins Dominic 12.17 and Daniel 12.40 scored a one-two for Essex with Kent's Luc Legon 13.20 in third in the men's race. Abigail Jennings 15.14 (Hampshire), Maddy Shott 15.02 (Middlesex) and Melanie Peddle (Essex/L) 17.08 occupied the top three ladies positions. Among the 15 starters were Leaguers Maureen Noel 18.30, Mark Culshaw 17.46 and Sean Pender dq, all representing Middlesex.

Meanwhile, 200 miles to the north, the country's top exponents were contesting the **British Grand Prix 20km** and national championships with places on the GB team to the European championships up for grabs. Callum Wilkinson finished third (2nd Brit) in 84.41 behind Tom Bosworth (Tonbridge) 83.10 and of Slovakia's Miroslav Uradnik 84.09. Fransisco Reis (TVH/L) 53.10 was third in the supporting 10km event.

Conditions for the premier track walks of the year; the **British Games 5km at Birmingham** on 1^{st} July were demanding to say the least with temperatures at track level 30c. Only six of the ten starters in the men's race satisfied the judges, amongst them EHAC's Callum Wilkinson 2^{nd} in 19.17 and his brother George (at 16, two years younger than anyone else to be invited) 6^{th} in 24.24, a pb. Tom Bosworth 19.01 followed up his previous week's victory in Leeds with yet another national title, a feat duplicated by Bethan Davies 22.04.

The turn out for the second 2018 **Woodford Tuesday 3km** races on 10th July was boosted by Noel Carmody's squad from south of the Thames, who swept up the places between them. Luc Legon (Bexley AC) was an easy winner in 13.21 and Maddy Shott (Belgrave H) his female counter-part 4th overall in 15.14. Melanie Peddle (Loughton AC/L) 4th 16.37, Mark Culshaw 6th 16.50 and Stuart Bennett 18.40 7th (both Ilford AC/L), John Borgars (Loughton AC/L) 9th 19.35, Geraldine Legon (Bexley AC/L) 12th 20.34, Steve Cartwright (Col &T/L) 14th 21.42, Peter Cassidy (Loughton AC/L) 15th 21.49 and Sean Pender (EHAC/L) 16th 22.43 also competed.

At the VAC 5 miles at Battersea Park also on 10th July, the highest placed Leaguer was Penelope Cummings (AFD) 49.01 in second place behind Ian Richards (Steyning AC) 43.09. Of the ten starters eight were Leaguers and in addition to Penelope, they were; John Hall 50.13, Maureen Noel 52.40 (both Belgrave), Dan Maskell (Surrey WC)54.48, Fiona Bishop (Woking AC), Michael Harran 58.09, David Hoben 58.17 and Peter Hannell 59.42 (all Surrey WC).
