



Excellent Olympic Debut for Callum Wilkinson

Congratulations to Callum Wilkinson on his 10th place Olympic debut. A large screen in the village hall enabled the Moulton community to support him as one. There was a terrific atmosphere. People who knew nothing about the discipline had their eyes riveted to the screen and spontaneous cheering and clapping broke out whenever a glimpse of him was caught or when his name appeared in the race positions, getting louder and louder as he moved up places from the 42nd he was in at 2km.



I chatted with Callum the day after his return from Japan and he told me that prior to the race, he had a dilemma in respect of his warm-up routine. In normal circumstances, it is of necessity a lengthy process to ensure that he is technically sound from the report of the starter's gun. But, in the oppressive heat he decided that a sacrifice in warmup energy would pay dividends in respect of energy levels in the latter stages of the race. As a result, he wasn't quite a fluid as he would like to have been in the early stages, but nevertheless he remained card-less, and it proved a



wise strategy, as he worked his way through the field (57 starters) to finished only 70 seconds from the bronze medal position.

The Gold medallist was Massimo Stano (Italy) 81.05 ahead of the Japanese duo of Koki Ikeda 81.14 and Toshikazu Yamanishi 81.28. Callum's time was 82.38 and Tom Bosworth who finished 6th at the last Olympics finished 25th this time in 25.57.

Virtual League tables

Jaqueline Benson is the overall Individual League leader ahead of Mark Williams with chasing packs behind them, although Millie Morris along with George Wilkinson and Jonathan Hobbs with races in hand could still surprise. Teamwise, EHAC and Ashford are well ahead with not much separating the Surrey WC and Ilford AC.

Leaguers in Action To qualify for Leaguer Status an athlete must participate in a six ERWL fixtures in a calendar year.

Dan Maskell was 5th/68.51 in the **Lancs WC Barnard 10km** on 3rd July. The race winner was Adrian Edwards 61.01.

Melanie Peddle now the Essex AA race walking Hon.Sec won the **England Master's inter-area 2km** at Nuneaton on 18th July in 10.28 and Emma Dyos finished 3rd in 10.58.

The third of the regular **VAC Battersea Park races** took place in perfect summer weather on 13th July in line with the present COVID-19 regulations. The course was 5k again, with the walkers in the last wave start.

Fast finishing Dave Annetts (N Herts Road Runners) won in a slightly better time than the previous month's race, whilst Melanie Peddle (Loughton AC) had her first win at Battersea Park this summer, in a time not far off her PB and Lesley Morris (Ilford AC) went home with a new PB, over 30 seconds improvement. All but one of the eight finishers were Leaguers with the exception being Colin Harle (Belgrave H) who finished in a very respectable time at his first attempt in this event.

In winning, Melanie Peddle 15.44, improved her pb in the **final 3km walk of the WT Meetings** on 8th August as did Emma Dyos 4th/16.28. Other Leaguers in the eight strong field race were Stuart Bennett 18.11, John Borgars 19.19 who both improved on their previous outings in the race this year and Lesley Morris 19.43.

The individual Series winners were raiders from south of the Thames Hannah Hopper and Luc Legon, but Ilford emerged the team winners. I'm sure I express the gratitude of all the competitors to Pauline Wilson and Peter Cassidy and of course the Woodford Club, for getting the Series up and running in spite of Covid-19.

Dominic King 1st/12.19 and brother Daniel 2/12.51 dominated the **Essex 3km track championships** at Chelmsford on 1st August. Stephen Crane was 3rd/15.23. Emma Dyos took the Women's title in 16.35 with Lesley Morris 2nd/19.44.

Competing as a guest in the **Welsh AA championships 10km** held at Cardiff on Sunday 15th August, George Wilkinson set a pb of 44.48 behind another guest IOM's Tom Partington 43.43 and Tonbridge's Guy Thomas 44.05 who actually won the Welsh Title.

On the same day at Chorley, Lancs WC promoted its annual **Reg Goodwin Trophy 10km**. The promoting club's Adrian Edwards 60.52 was the winner and Leaguer Dave Hoben (Surrey WC) took part and clocked 72.04. *There is a tenuous link here, because Reg Goodwin was a Surrey WC member when he won the Olympic silver medal at the 1924 Games staged in Paris. The distance was 10km and was won by Italy's Ugo Frigerio in 47.49. Reg clocked 48.37. He spent much of his later life in the Leigh area of Lancashire, and I remember meeting him several times when I first started race walking in the late fifties.*
