Sean Pender is a tireless worker for Enfield & Haringey AC, and up until recent times a regular member of the Club's race walking squad. In his racing days he was renowned along with Bernie Hercock for being a prolific event supporter averaging annually on occasion more races than there are weeks in the year. In Sean's case many of the races he competed in were in his native Ireland where he won national age group championships and senior place awards. In this country with the likes of Arthur Thomson and Ron Powell he won won Middlesex and National team medals and in

recognition of his service to that county as an official, he was elevated to a term as its President.

Sean achieved a long-held ambition when in August 2008, at Milton Keynes he qualified as a Centurion. Passing through 50 miles in 11.21.01 he went on to clock 23.56.11 to become Enfield's twelfth walker to be admitted to the Brother/Sisterhood. Two years later at Colchester he improved his time with a 23.39.50 performance.

Leaguers in Action To qualify for Leaguer Status an athlete must participate in a six ERWL fixtures in a calendar year.

Two Leaguers; Tony Bell 2nd/113.27 and Dave Hoben 5th/135.22 participated in the Lancashire WC 10 miles on 29th March, for the **Macclesfield Shield.** The race winner was Nigel Shaw 106.31.

On eighth April nine walkers toed the line for the first of the summer's **VAC weekday races** at Battersea Park. The distance contested was 5km and the overall race winner was Stefano Zennaro in 27.45. The Leaguers in action at this event were: Melanie Peddle 3rd/29.10, Chik Ha Kwok 5th/31.01, Man Biu Lam 32.46, Fiona Bishop 7th/35.22 and Dave Hoben 8th/37.32

Callum Wilkinson 84.08, finished third in the 20km race in the World Athletics Gold Meeting at **Rio Maior**, Portugal on 12th April. The race winner was Brazilian Caio Bonfim in 80.47. It was Callum's first top three finish in a WA Walking Tour Gold meeting, after a sprint finish to get the better of Portugal's legendary Joao Vieira, who has been prominent on the international scene since 2004.

Virtual ERWL News - They Just keep Going!

A couple of pen portraits of the ERWL Virtual competitors. Neither are Leaguers, but I have no doubt had they lived nearer north London they would have been. Both have been competing for over 50 years appearing in many Enfield events in the process.

Ron Penfold M80

I came across this picture in *Athletics Weekly* of Ron Penfold winning the Sussex 20 miles championship in 1965 and although not a Leaguer, he has supported Enfield promotions since 1960, when as a junior in the Enfield Open 7 of that year he finished 46th/155, just 12 seconds short of beating the hour.

I had come across Ron a month earlier in the RWA National Junior 5 at Wembley where he helped his club Steyning AC win the team title finishing 7th/47 clocking 42.59 in the process. My lasting memory of the occasion was that Tom Misson, twice the Italian 100km winner and fifth just a few weeks earlier at the Rome Olympics presented the awards.

Ron tells me that the Sussex championship was held totally on the A23 starting at Withdean stadium out to Bolney, where they turned in the middle of the road and retraced their steps – Can you believe it! Dennis Read, whose brother Norman won the 1956 Olympic 50km,



tagged Ron for most of the way and as the finish neared Ron was experiencing severe cramp in his thighs, hence the pained expression on his face.

Ed Shillabeer M85



Ed sent the following message when registering his virtual performance: 5 km. 50:35. 5,888 steps! Average speed 10:07 per kilometre. Sunny and warm down on the cycle path course (up and back plus around car park to complete exact distance as recorded by Strava. I am a Happy bunny as I am managing my efforts to take account of my aortic stenosis, due for scan on April 10. Yours in sport -Edbanger!

Ed started his athletic career as a runner before concentrating on race walking via evening track meetings in his local Vets League. In recent times he has raced in Ilford AC colours and he's also appeared for other Clubs including London Vidarians, Dawlish & South Devon and Plymouth City Walkers.

Attaining Centurion status in the 1976 Leicester – Skegness taking number 590 in 21.45.19. In atrocious conditions he won the 1989 Eddlestone 100 at Hendon in a time of clocked 18.11.08.

His racing career now stretching over five decades is littered with outstanding endurance performances; Guernsey Churches, Isle of Man Churches, the still standing 9.41.54 100km national record set in 1985. Two years earlier he came 3rd (from 64 finishers) in the "Fosters Quadrathon" (2 miles swim/50K walk/100 miles' Marathon run) commencing in Brighton/ending at Gravesend.

As recently as the 2023 TCS London Marathon he was one of only 12 over 80 finishers. He has completed more Plymouth marathons than anyone else. The list goes on. See the *Essex Walker* 389 August/September 2019 edition for Dave Ainsworth's comprehensive feature to celebrate Ed's 80th birthday.
