• MEMBERS' MEETING – 13 December 2006

Present – Eight members and one observer – Apologies three

Financial Update – We now have around £900 in the bank, also a few club vests, one distance measurer, some club medals and a crate of 24 cans of lager (out of date – left over from Saltburn). The £900 is the minimum balance that we must now maintain to keep the club running. Saltburn advance costs are around £400 and new vest orders come in at around £350. Then there are affiliation fees and team fees when we enter teams for championship races. The good news is that there should now be no further need for club members to 'bankroll' activities and purchases. The club can now 'stand on its feet'.

• Club Fees for 2007

From 2007, club affiliations will be to UK Athletics rather than North of England AA. UKA are going to **increase** fees over the next two years to bring all territorial areas into line. It was decided to increase club fees to offset these increased charges. There will be a further increase in 2008.

For 2007, competing members will pay £12. Officials, students and junior athletes aged 12 to 20 on 1st Jan will pay £6. Walkers aged 11 or less on 1st Jan will pay £1. Competing members means those who race in Winter League 10km, North of England or Northern Area Championships, open events and nationals. Officials **MAY** compete in **Redcar Race Walking Club Championship** events **without paying any more than the £6** but as soon as they enter the open competitive arena they will need to pay the full fees.

You will all be delighted to know that fees are due NOW. Please make cheques payable to Redcar RWC. The last date for payment at the above rates will be 27 February at the AGM. After that any outstanding fees will be collected with a £5 surcharge. We hope that this new arrangement will improve the efficiency of fee collection and reduce the need for reminders.

• Attendance at Meetings

It was felt by some members that decisions are consistently being made by the same group of people because other members do not attend. Some have never attended a meeting yet! They feel that members should make more effort to attend or at the very least send an apology. Please remember that we don't 'spin meetings out'. They last an hour only.
