

Chris Maddocks recognised in New Year's Honours

Five-time Olympian Chris Maddocks awarded a B.E.M for Services to Athletics.

Christopher ("Chris") Maddocks (born 28th March 1957) competed in five consecutive Summer Olympics from 1984 to 2000. He retired from international competition after the 50km race at the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney, Australia. He became the first British track athlete to compete in five Olympic Games.

Born in Tiverton, Devon, he started in athletics as a cross country runner, and had ambitions to run marathons. Prior to the 1980 Summer Olympics in Moscow, he set a new British record (4:06:43 in Gydnia, Poland) in the 50 km but was not chosen for the Games. He broke the record again (4:06:14 in Colombes, France) a month after the Olympics, retiring from the sport on a "semi-basis" for two and a half years.

Chris made his first Olympic appearance at the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, finishing the 50km in sixteenth place (4:26:33).

Chris finished second in the English Commonwealth Games trials in 1986, qualifying him for the 1986 Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh. At the Games, he finished the 30km race in fourth position (2:12:42).

At the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul, South Korea, he finished in 24th position in the men's 20km (1:23:46). He competed once more for the British Olympic team at the 2000 Summer Olympics. He had set an Olympic qualifying time of 3:57:10 at the Dutch 50km championship race in March 2000. Prior to the games he was declined National Lottery funding and he couldn't find a shoe sponsor, although ASICS sent him a complimentary pair. He injured his hamstring a week before the race but entered the race nonetheless; he fell behind the rest of the athletes. He entered the Stadium Australia as *I'm Gonna Be (500 Miles)* by The Proclaimers was played over the loudspeakers in his honour, and as the 100,000 crowd cheered him on to finish. His time was 4:52:04, more than an hour after Robert Kozeniowski won the race. His completion of the race meant that he became the first British track athlete to compete in five Olympic Games.

After the 2000 Summer Olympics, his lack of an honour in the New Year's Honours List was criticised and he took a break from competitive athletics. He sought Lottery funding once more in order to compete at the 2002 Commonwealth Games in Manchester. After



a year, he hadn't ruled out attempting to qualify for the 2004 Summer Olympics. In April 2002, two months after he started studying journalism at University of Leeds, he announced his retirement from international athletics.

He won an award for services to athletics at the 2000 British Athletics Writers Awards, having become a freelance journalist following his retirement from athletics.

For the 2012 Summer Olympics and 2017 IAAF World Athletics Championships in

London he was specialist TV sports commentator for the racewalking events for American television network NBC.

Chris remains the British 50km walk record-holder thanks to his 3:51:37 at Burrator, Devon on 28^{th} October 1990.

Olympic Silver Medallist Tests Positive for Steroid

Mexico's Olympic silver medallist María Guadalupe González-Romero, better known as Lupita González has tested positive for an anabolic steroid.

The IAAF's Athletics Integrity Unit says González tested positive for trenbolone and has been provisionally suspended.

The 29-year-old faces a ban of up to four years.

González took silver in the 20km walk at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Olympic Games, losing to Liu Hong of China by two seconds, and at the 2017 World Championships in London. In 2016 and 2018 she took gold in the 20km at the IAAF World Team Championships in Rome and Taicang.

González has denied taking the drug and has suggested it could have come from meat she ate in the days leading up to the test.

Trenbolone is similar to the asthma drug clenbuterol, both of which are often fed to cattle in Mexico to boost metabolism and burn fat.

2019 IAAF World Championships Qualification Standards

The IAAF Council has announced the qualification standards for the IAAF World Athletics Championships in Doha. Different from previous world championships, target numbers have been announced for the road events and 10,000m races. 100 for the marathons, 60 for each of the 20km race walks, 50 for the men's 50km and 30 for the women's 50km and 27 each for the 10,000m runs.

The IAAF standards for the race walks are:

20km	Men (60)	1:22:30	Women (60)	1:33:30
50km	Men (50)	3:59:00	Women (30)	4:30:00

The qualification period extends from 7^{th} March 2018 to midnight on 6^{th} September 2019.

2019 European Athletics Race Walking Permit Meetings

The dates for the 2019 European Athletics Race Walking Permit Meeting series have been released.

There will be three events in the build-up to the European Race Walking Cup in Alytus, Lithuania on 19th May, beginning with the 38th edition of the Dudinska 50km in Dudince, Slovakia on 23rd March.

The Dudinska 50km is expected to attract another top-level international field with race walkers looking to secure the 50km race walk qualifying times for the IAAF World Championships in Doha.

The second event on the programme is the annual event in Podebrady, Czech Republic on 6th April followed by the Naumburg Race Walking event in Germany on 13th April.

Eric Lee R.I.P.

The Race Walking Association is saddened to report the passing of former Wakefield Harrier Eric Lee aged 88 after a long battle with cancer.

Eric was a member of Wakefield's successful race walking team of the 1960's and a counter when the team won the Northern 50km Championship in 1968 and 1969 and took second place in the National 50km in the same year.

He became a Centurion (N° 429) in the Leicester 24 hour Tarck race in 1969 completing the 100 miles in 21:10:37, going on to complete 105 miles 986 yards. In 1970 he had probably his finest race when he won the Isle of Man race over the 37.75 mile TT Course.

He moved to Fort William with his job with British Rail and later ran a successful Bed & Breakfast business together with a cycle hire outlet

Sarnia WC 815m Hill Climb, Le Val des Terres, St Peter Port, Guernsey (Sun. 16th Dec.)

Fastest man up the hill in the Val des Terres time trial was Stuart Le Noury recording his 12th win in a time of 4:46 to take home the Rob Waterman Hill Climb Shield in this annual event first contested in 1966.

Women's winner Donna Allan removed five seconds from her best time to take the Ladies Shield in a time of 6:13 and equalled the age group best set by Marie MacDonald a few years ago. Making the most of the good conditions, she finished ahead of Wendy Wilson, who also recorded a new best time of just under seven minutes. Third place went to Jayne Le Noury, a few seconds ahead of Kay Coulson.

Jason Le Noury, making a rare appearance walked 5:09 for second place in the mens section. Walk of the day was probably by Kevin Allan in 5th place who removed 41 seconds from his previous best time

The Race Walking Association is saddened to report the passing on 16th December of former Sheffield United Harrier LoI Allen aged 97. LoI represented Great Britain in the 10,000m walk at the 1952 Olympic Games in Helsinki and the 1950 European Athletic Championships in Brussels.

He won the RWA National 10 mile and 20 mile Championships from 1949 to 1951 and won the 20 mile again in 1954 and 1958.

Enfield Race Walking League - 2018 Review

In spite of extreme winter weather that caused the cancellation of race three and equally extreme summer temperatures, the 21st ERWL produced some excellent racing, *writes Ron Wallwork*. Although the total number of walkers dropped by two dozen, those who did take part, did more races over the season and the aggregate performances, even with a cancelled fixture was two up on those of the previous year. So, it seems that the aim of League founder Martin Oliver, to provide regular race walking competition for competitors of all standards is still being met and the League is indebted to the scores of people who give freely of their time and at their own expense to attend and officiate at the races

David Crane achieved his season's target by winning the individual League title whilst the 2017 overall winner Helen Middleton finished overall runner-up and so retained her Ladies crown with Melanie Peddle who finished third overall, breathing down her neck only a handful of points behind. Third placed lady Fiona Bishop who was 9th overall extended her remarkable League medal tally to a round dozen

Stuart Bennett headed a three man rush for the men's minor places ahead of the defending champion Mark Culshaw and George Wilkinson; just 12 points covering the three of them. Steve won the 1st Centurion accolade and George the Outstanding Junior award.

Belgrave's Maddy Shott burst onto the scene with wins in the League's two major open races; the Moulton Five and the Enfield Seven and in the latter event Dominic King recorded a record breaking eighth victory.

With two in the women's top three and three men in their top ten, the Enfield & HAC team had a winning combination. The Stuart Bennett revived Ilford AC team finished second and Surrey WC third.

A feature of the series was the emergence of Ilford AC's ladies, particularly Rachel Lawless and Leslie Morris whose 785 points contribution to their club's total points tally ensured the team runner-up position for their club. Emma Dyos made an impressive league debut in mid-season over 5km and finished the series with a sub 70 minute clocking for open seven miles.

In addition to welcoming new walkers and some returning after an absence, there were permanent "Goodbyes" to Peter Emery, Bernie Hercock, Russell Vroobel and Doug Fotheringham.

LOOKING TO 2019 - The 2019 edition looks full of promise. Defending champions Enfield could be hard pressed to retain the trophy if the resurgent Ilford squad maintains its progress. Surrey, strengthened by a fit Malcolm Martin and new signing Francisco Reis could turn out to be the team to beat, but if Belgrave's newcomers Maddy Shott and Stephano Zennaro along with a fit John Hall turn out on a regular basis their club could be the dark horse.

Martin Oliver: The 2018 Enfield Open seven concluded the 21st edition of the ERWL which was inaugurated by Martin Oliver in 1998.



Martin was born with connections to Enfield athletic club and indeed race walking; His uncles Ernie, Bill and George were competing in the 1920's/30's and his father "young Sid" as he was referred to won club championships.

Martin started off as a runner and finished 4th in the Hertfordshire Schools 5000m and later did 61 minute 10 miles, but shortly afterwards he tore a calf muscle which put an end to any serious ambitions he held and so running's loss became race walking's gain. Over the period 1970 to 1990/91 he proved to be a better than average walker, racing distances from a 7:06 1500m to a 12.38:10 track 100km. In between these

distances Martin set pb's of 14:32 for 3km, 25:05 for 5km, 52:18 for 10km, 56:29 for 7 miles, 82:42 for 10 miles and 1:46:18 for 20km.

An accountant by profession his qualifications made him a natural for organising and his aptitude for figures an absolute whiz with

numbers, producing handicap results in super-quick time in the days before computers.

However, his greatest contribution was resurrecting an ailing walking section at Enfield and instigating the Enfield Race Walking League. On behalf of the hundreds who have participated in the ERWL over the past 21 years a HUGE THANK YOU MARTIN! Ron Wallwork


