World Race Walk Team Championships 2022 no longer to be held in Belarus

World Athletics has announced that Minsk will no longer host the next World Athletic Race Walk Team Championships, which were scheduled to take place in the Belarusian capital on April 23 and 24, 2022.

The decision was based primarily on the uncertainties that remain in the future regarding diplomatic relations and the international travel restrictions for the country that currently exist, which would create difficulties for the organisation of the event.

World Athletics is currently negotiating with alternative host cities for this event and expects to announce a new venue by the next Council meeting on 28-29 July.

Dominic King has asked BOA to over-rule UKA decision



Three months ago, when Dominic King achieved his life goal of breaking Chris Maddocks' long-standing British record for 50km race walk, he told AW he hoped his performance would earn him a spot in the British Olympic team despite his time being outside the qualifying standard for Tokyo.

The Colchester athlete clocked 3:51:13 in the Dudince 50km in Slovakia on March 20 to take 24 seconds off a national record that Maddocks has held since 1990 and, despite missing the Olympic qualifying mark of 3:50:00, he felt he would get an invitation from World Athletics via its rankings system.

This has happened but UK Athletics has not accepted the World Athletics invitation and now King, 38, has written to the British Olympic Association arguing that "the rules of fairness and due process have been violated".

UKA has added athletes to its team via the World Athletics invitations this week such as high jumper Emily Borthwick, sprint hurdler David King, 1500m runner Revee Walcott-Nolan, 200m man Nethaneel Mitchell-Blake and sprinter Jona Efoloko in the sprint relay.

King's letter to the BOA says in part: "I am publicly requesting that the BOA accept the World Athletics invitation received by British Athletics for me to participate in the Tokyo Olympic 50km Race Walk based on the overall World Rankings invite system.

"The BOA should not be satisfied with my non-nomination for selection, as basic rules of fairness and due process were violated.

"When World Athletics released the dual world ranking/auto-qualified times system (new for this Olympic cycle), it was designed with the view to National Governing Bodies around the world adopting such a system.

"Great Britain has two athletes who have qualified through ranking quota for this summer's Olympic 50km walk — an amazing achievement considering severely restricted access to training and competitions, during the pandemic. Indeed, the British 50km walkers have had only one opportunity in order to qualify these past 18 months. "In what is an event that is already discriminated against, with its removal from the 2024 Olympic programme and with reduced competition opportunities and limited qualification periods, it is astounding that our federation prohibited their 50km race walkers the opportunity to compete in their area championships in May (European Race Walking Team Championships).

"I request the BOA overrule British Athletics to select me to participate in the 50km Race Walk at the Tokyo Olympic Games, in accord with the World Athletics invite for me to do so."

XXXIV Gran Premio Internacional de Marcha Cantones de A Coruña, Spain (Sat. 5th Jun.)

Women's 20km: Colombian Sandra Lorena Arenas was the winner of the women's 20km.

Shortly after the start a lead group of five emerged from the fifty-eight starters that included Glenda Morejon (ECU), Erica Rocha De Sena (BRA), Sandra Arenas and Mexicans Alegna González and Ilse Guerrero with all reaching 5km 22:13.

10km was reached in 44:21 with Sena leading. By 15km (1:06:13) the quintet of women was reduced to two Sena and Arenas. Shortly after 17km Arenas takes the lead which she maintains to the finish, clocking 1:28:24. Alegna González catches and passes Sena for second (1:28:40) and an exhausted Sena crosses the line in 1:28:44.

Heather Lewis was the first Briton home in 1:35.47 with Bethan Davies next in 1:39.32.

Men's 20km: Spaniard Diego García Carrera won the men's 20km race defeating Sweden's Perseus Karlstrom who went into the event as favourite having won last month's European Race Walk Team Championship in Podebrady.

Seventy-six athletes started, with nothing much happening during the first half of the race apart from the occasional change of leader from the forty strong lead group. 5km was reached in 20:30 and 10km in 40:46 with the lead pack reduced to around thirty athletes.

The lead changed a number of times during the next 5km with 15km reached in 1:00:43. Karlstrom then went to the front and recorded 3.50 for the sixteenth kilometre. At seventeen kilometres Garcia, Karlstrom & Alvaro Martin are together. Garcia made a decisive at 18km and crossed the line in 1:19:37 covering the final 5km in 18:53.

There was great news for Callum Wilkinson as he secured a PB and Olympic qualifying standard with a time of 1:20.32 for sixth place to confirm his place for Tokyo.

Tom Bosworth finished in a season best of 1:21.37 for 14^{th} while Cameron Corbishley clocked 1:26.37.

British Athletics Track & Field Championships, Sport City, Manchester (Sun. 27th Jun.)

Tom Bosworth and Bethan Davies dominated their respective races.

In the men's race Bosworth, won his seventh British track title recording 1000m splits of 3:49.70, 3:48.05, 3:50.08 (11:27.83 at 3000m), 3:48.38 and 3:39.40 crossing the line in 18:55.61. However he incurred a 30 second penalty after receiving three red cards in the final 150 meteres of the race, which was added to his time, thus it being recorded as 19:52.62.



Cameron Corbishley, with 20:37.69, and Guy Thomas, with a personal best 21:31.16, took silver and bronze.

In the women's race, Davies, opened with fast first 1000 of 4:22.90, and followed this up with 4:30.83, 4:38.29 (13:32.02 for 3000m), 4:40.42 and 4:35.41, clocking 22:47.85.



The women's podium was completed by Abigail Jennings (U23), with a time of 25:39.68 and Hannah Hopper (U20) with a personal best of 26:34.71.

Domestic Results

Tonbridge AC Evening Open Meeting inc. Kent County Race Walk Championships, Tonbridge School (Tue. 1st Jun.)

The 3000m race walk, together with the 5000m and steeple-chase were removed from the Kent County main championship weekend in May as a condition of the event licence, so that track time could be freed up to allow more space between the other track events due to COVID. Tonbridge AC offered to stage these omitted events inconjunction with their various evening open meetings.

After a blazing hot day, competitors were greeted with alomost ideal conditions for the 7.40pm start. Luc Legon led from the gun and clocked another sub-13 performance, to retain the title he won in 2019 (race not held in 2020 due to COVID). Christian Hopper overhauled Ashford's Jonathan Hobbs in the latter stages to cross the line in second overall and take the U17 men's title. Hobbs took silver in the senior men's championship.

During the early part of the race there was a four way battle between Millie Morris, Jaqcueline Benson, Hannah Hopper and Abigail Smith. Benson and Smith were the first to be dropped. Hopper took the lead late on and pushed on hard to take the U20 women's title. Smith rallied in the latter stages to close in on Morris recording a personal best 15:35.51.

John Brock 25.09.1949 - 17.06.2021

The Race Walking Association is saddened to report the death of John Brock (Southend-on-Sea AC)

"A thoroughly nice man" – the sentiment echoed repeatedly following the shock news of John's death.

He and I grew up as neighbours, although the four-year age difference meant our paths didn't cross much.

Then unbeknownst to each other we joined the Athletic Club more-orless at the same time: John, aged 14, at the end of June 1964 and me a fortnight later.

In June 1985 John was part of the successful Division 2 Men's squad along with such other notables as Graham Payne, Trevor Woods, and David Turner [both former County Pentathlon Champions] and Tony Shiret [now Chairman of Essex Beagles] amongst a squad of other very talented athletes.

John supported the Boxing Day Pier Handicap Race for several years almost always wearing his favourite striped sweater.

In later years, in his early 60s, he decided to take up Race Walking ultimately becoming the Club's Race-Walking Secretary. In the Vets' League he raced over every available distance winning almost every Walking race. By the time of his last appearance in the League, in July 2019, he had represented the team in all the sprints, sprint and lap hurdles, 7 of the 8 field events [he drew the line at Pole Vault] and every walking distance on the programme.

In 2014 John was awarded Life Membership of the Club – the same year he added Park runs to his event list.

Later that year we offered our venue to The Centurions Club in order that they could stage their annual 24-hour event.

It was an experience like no other for our Club, being in attendance right through the evening, overnight and watching sunrise the following morning. The event was a great success on many fronts, but overall due to the painstaking organisational skills that John possessed.

Following that he turned his attention to creating a results package for our open meeting which although it had worked very well, John was planning to upgrade.

In February 2020 John competed, as ever, in the Essex/Eastern Indoor Championships, adding a further, and ultimately his last, gold medal to his collection as winner of the V70 One Mile Walk.

Lockdowns from March that year put paid to any further competition. So that was his final race.
