World Athletics Selects Muscat, Oman to host 2022 Race Walking Team Championships



OMAN CONVENTION & EXHIBITION CENTRE

World Athletics announced at its annual congress in Tokyo that the Sultanate of Oman is the new host of the 2022 World Race Walking Team Championships.

The event will take place in March 2022 at Oman Convention & Exhibition Centre (OCEC) in Muscat and will be organised in partnership between Oman Sail, the Oman Athletics Association and OCEC.

The event will be held in Oman for the first time in the Middle East and is expected to attract 1700 athletes.

Oman intends to turn this event into a wider celebration of athletics. As well as the elite male and female 20 kilometres race walk events, under-20 male and female 10km race walk events and a 35km combined race, it will feature masters' categories, 1km and 2km kids' runs and a park-run festival.

Nine teams met to contest the England Masters Inter Area Match at Nuneaton in torrid conditions, reports Andrew Clough. Separate men's and women's races over 2000m took place on the hottest day of the year so far. The photo finish camera could not cope, so all events were hand timed.

Carolyn Derbyshire was the early leader in the women's race. Melanie Peddle took the contact rule right to the limit as she tried to keep up, eventually overtaking Carolyn to come home in 10:26.1 with just a single warning from the judges. Carolyn also kept a clean card and was runner up in 10:34.3, whilst Emma Dyos maintained a clear third place in 10:58.6.

The men's race was a similar tussle between the representatives of MMAC and EMAC. This time Adam Hills could not get past Mark Williams who won in 10:23.0. Adam did attract an early red card yet kept his form and second place in a time of 10:41.6. Colin Harle, Chris Hobbs, and Roger Michell were always close together from the start, Colin eventually pulling away for third place in 12:18.2. The final group of walkers had to take extra care when a flurry of red cards arrived late in the race, leaving all of them with two red discs on the posting board. Three survived, but sadly two suffered disqualification.

Good support today and the threat of inclement conditions did not materialise despite poor weather north and south of the race venue until an hour before the off, *writes Dave Evans*. Actual race number three of the 20/21 season brought together a well-balanced field of ten with quality walking and times throughout. Adrian Edwards and Tony Malone were asked to give the rest of their colleagues a four minute start which gave everyone something to chase so all finished within a six minute window. Competition usually brings the best out of performers and the physical presence of club colleagues gave an extra incentive. With this event under their belts, I suspect all walkers will improve the times as we head towards the autumn.

Leading home the aspirants at the end of the 10km was the tall figure of Adrian Edwards who rattled off laps in 20:26, 20:25 & 20:10 producing a final time of 61:01. Tony Malone chased him home with a very solid 62:11 (21:04, 20:43 & 20:26). A much improved Martin Payne (pictured below) destroyed his old PB with an eye opening 63:47 (21:19, 21:09, 21:19). Stuart Edgar made a worthwhile journey from the Midlands posting an encouraging 67:04(22:10, 22:23 & 22:31). Dan Maskell made the long journey from Brighton and showed he is gradually getting back to his usual good standard and as always attracted compliments on his walking style. His 68:51 (22:36, 23:03 & 23:12) is a good standard to start from. Ian Hilditch appears to have recovered from his 20+ day traverse of the Pennine Way recording 69:31 reflecting his physical strength on a testing course. Roy Gunnett is another stylish walker and his 71:16 was a solid performance with a good opening lap of 23:13 and follow up laps of 23:45 & 24:18. Joe Hardy is a model of consistency and laps 23:32, 23:58 & 23:51 show that his pace judgement is still intact. 71:21 is proof of his ability to churn out solid times. Pat Evans walked well with laps in 23:33, 23:59 and 23:57 and a finishing time of 71:29. She has managed to hold her form from the Bury track race. Phil McCullagh employed his normal tactics of gradually increasing his pace recording a first lap in 24:41, a second in 23:42 and a swift 23:18 for his final lap. A final time of 71:41 made him the fourth walker with a 71 minute clocking.
